I immediately recalled a note seen on some hints on my Ancestry DNA account:

The facts in this collection were found using artificial intelligence technology and may contain errors. The facts in this collection were found using a combination of technologies, including machine learning to extract names and details, and Optical Character Recognition (OCR) to create text from images. Please review details carefully, including the original record, to confirm their accuracy.

So, this 'transformative shift' has invaded the realm of genealogical research. Check out Amy Johnson Crow's view on how to use and understand Al.
