SUBMIT YOUR LINEAGE CHART

Below is an example of hand-made Lineage Chart #1 with 5 generations. It quickly and at a glance captures the names/dates/places of your DIRECT ancestors' birth/marriage/death dates. The names of great great grandparents go on the far right, and have a number next to each. That numeral indicates the subsequent chart where their details will be entered, so that the tree may 'grow' and 'branch' as more details may be uncovered.

Don't worry about missing or blank entries on your chart...they are opportunities for you to see where there are gaps needing *further research*.

These charts also help other genealogists quickly help give you pointers on what/where you might go next in your research.

You can also see migration patterns by studying the locations of each generation's birth, marriage and places of death.

Fill-in, to the best of your ability and knowledge, your own Chart #1 and submit it to MAGIC for posterity. You can turn-in a printed chart, or e-mail it to david.jackson@orderlypackrat.com

You never know who might see it and have an idea/s for you.

Or, even more excitingly, a long-lost cousin may contact you that shares a common ancestor with you. And, they may have lots of information and photos passed down their way that you may have never seen!

The GREEN BOOK of Metropolitan Kansas City

Inspired by the 2018 movie Green Book, set in 1962, the Greater Kansas City Black History Study Group presents a list of safe stops printed in the 1940 and 1949 editions of The Negro Motorist Green Book. The film is inspired by the true story of a journey through the Deep South between African-American classical and jazz pianist Don Shirley and Tony Vallelonga, an Italian-American bouncer who served as Shirley's driver and bodyguard.

In 1936, an African-American postal carrier from Harlem named Victor Green published a book that was part travel guide and part survival guide. The Negro Motorist Green Book helped African Americans navigate safe passage across the highways and byways of segregated America, well into the 1960s.

Even in their own neighborhoods, African Americans were unwelcome guests in some hotels, clothing stores and eateries. For 25 cents, the nearly 50-page book gave weary travelers a listing of restaurants, hotels, night clubs, gas stations and offered some road warriors an early day version of a bed and breakfast in private homes.

The movie Green Book reveals some of the nation's segregated havens in notorious "sundown towns" 1 long before minorities had access to Yelp and Trip Advisor reviews. We welcome your comments about the sanctuaries listed below.

Adopted Missourian Was The Author Of The 13th Amendment Abolishing Slavery

As a member of the 1861 State Convention he helped keep Missouri in the Union and while U. S. Senator from Missouri he was the author of the Thirteenth Amendment to the Constitution abolishing slavery and advocated Negro suffrage which formed the basis of the Fifteenth Amendment. Do you know his name?

1. What was his background?

A. Of southern parentage, he was born near Danville, Virginia, November 18, 1826. He moved with his parents to Lincoln County, Missouri, in 1832, and when nine years old was left an orphan. After attending schools in Lincoln and Pike counties he taught school, studied law, and was admitted to the bar in Pike County in 1848. From 1848 to 1861 he practiced law in Louisiana, Missouri.

2. How did he begin his public career?

A. He served from 1848 to 1850 and from 1856 to 1858 as a representative in the State Legislature where he was active in supporting legislation granting State aid to railroads and took a prominent part in framing the general banking act of 1857.

He was a Douglas delegate to the 1860 Charleston and Baltimore National Democratic conventions and in 1856 and 1860 he was a presidential elector.

3. What were his beliefs about secession in the 1861 State Convention?

A. He was a states' rights Democrat, but when the issue was drawn in 1861, he strongly op-

attorney to prosecute the whiskey ring in St. Louis in 1875, as president of the Chicago National Republican Convention in 1884, and was a delegate to the Pan-American Congress in 1889. He retired from practice in 1889 and moved to Washington D. C., where he lived until his death April 12, 1913.

6. What was his name?

A. John Brooks Henderson.

Lost, Thirsty Parakeet Awaits Claim of Owner

posed secession in Missouri and was an influential Union delegate to the State Convention. He opposed coercion of the seceded states and blamed the abolitionists of the North for having provoked the trouble. The fall of Fort Sumter and the call for troops, however changed his opinions to coercion and he raised a brigade of militia which saw four months service.

4. What were his accomplishments in the U. S. Senate?

A. In 1862 he was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Truston Polk as U. S. Senator and was elected for a six-year term to the same office in 1863. In the Senate he was the author of the Thirteenth amendment, advocated Negro suffrage, and effected the reimbursement from the the Federal treasury of Missouri's war expenditures.

He found it hard to reach a decision in the impeachment trial of President Andrew Johnson and harder still to vote against his party. But when a telegram demanding that he vote for conviction came from St. Louis he replied: "Say to my friends that I have sworn to do impartial justice according to law and conscience and I will try to do it like an honest man." He voted "not guilty." For this act he was hanged in effigy by Missouri Radicals and failed to be re-elected to the Senate.

5. What did he do after he left the Senate?

A. He practiced law in St. Louis, served as assistant U. S. district

trouble enticing the bird, but a glass of water did the trick. She held out the water, and the bird was promptly attracted.

Mrs. Strehlmann would be very glad to find the owner of the bird, and get it returned to its home and cage.

This was found by *GENERATIONS* editor, David W. Jackson, when he was researching for the biography of his great great grandfather, Arthur Jackson, who was born a slave in Charleston, W/VA, and moved with his slaveholding family, Richard and Lucinda Jackson, in 1859 to Franklin County, Missouri.
