

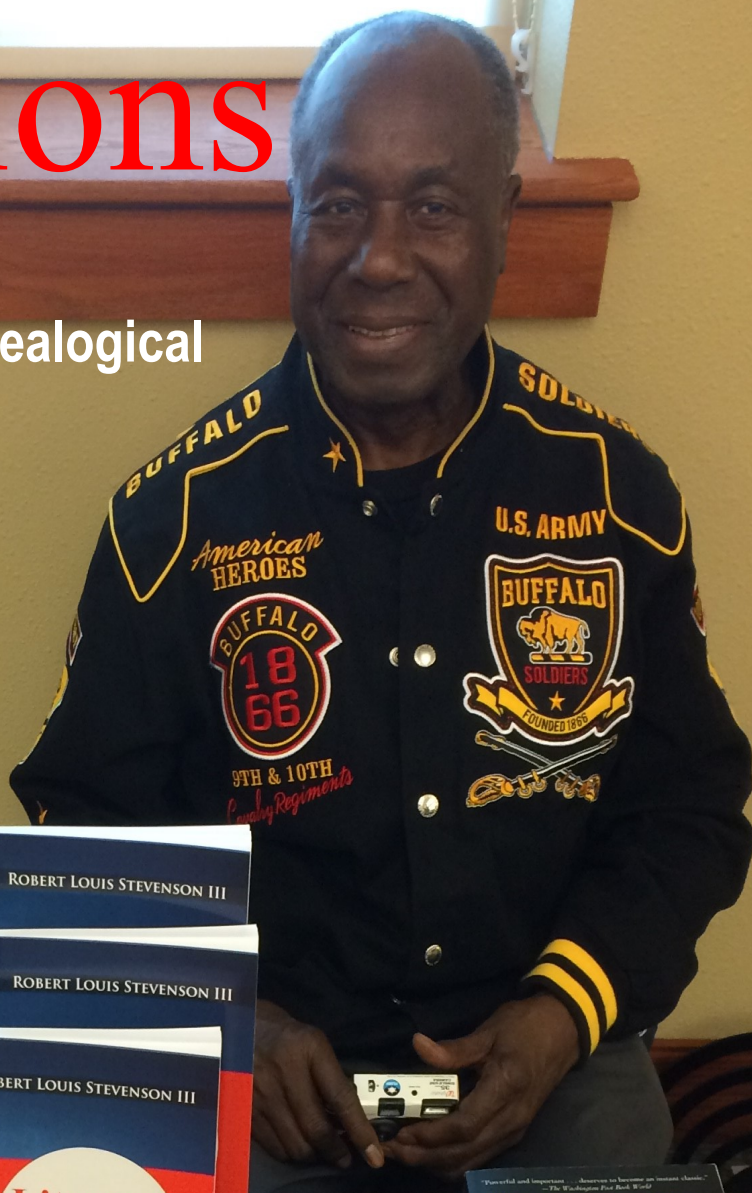

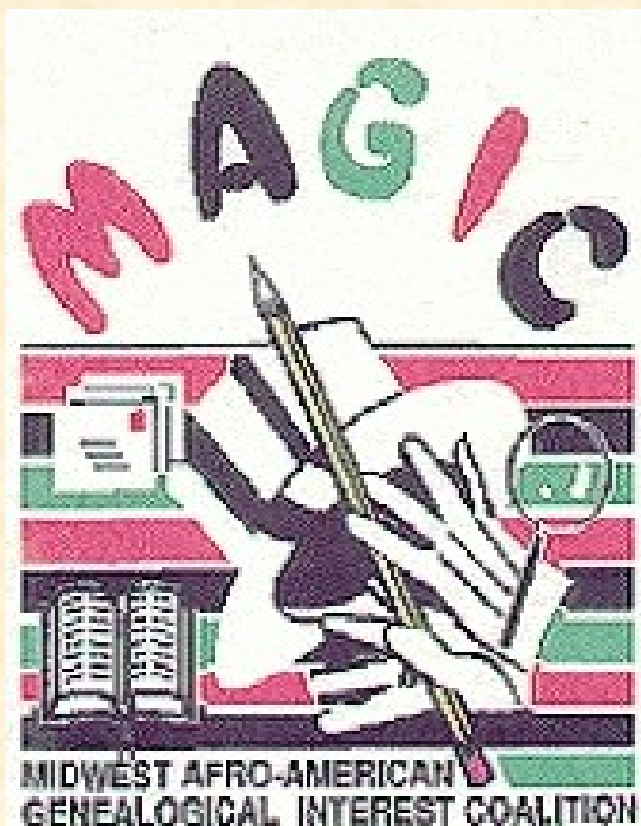

MISSION POSSIBLE, 2018 Should You Choose to Accept the Challenge

MAGIC is a genealogy-centered organization. For more than 25 years we have encouraged researchers with African ancestry to begin discovering their forbearers.

Whether you are a beginner, novice, or advanced family historian, there is always something you might learn—or, share—at a MAGIC gathering that will benefit the group.

Generations magazine for the last couple of years have utilized a query service to readers hoping to connect individuals with common ancestors from specific localities, or just to connect and learn from one another about a place in time where their ancestor's lived, worked and played.

This year, we are introducing a new campaign, and we'd like anyone reading to answer this call to action.

MAGIC members and friends are encouraged to share their lineage charts.

Not only will the charts be filed with the organization's collections. But, we also wish to publish them in future editions of *Generations* magazine so that the names therein may get indexed and more readily be available to readers...now and in the future.

Attending MAGIC meetings for the last half-a-decade, I've noticed

that there are a fair number of people who have ancestors who either lived or came from the same place in the country.

Those who have been among the membership longer than I will recognize the many times a "long-lost" cousin met one another at a MAGIC meeting.

The possibilities are endless; but, we need to start with a common foundation in order to be most efficient in sharing details that other genealogists need.

What is a lineage chart?

The lineage chart (sometimes called a Pedigree Chart) is the essential document of any genealogist, and forms the "tree" with which most people associate family history.

The chart starts generally with the person making the chart, and then details their parents, grandparents, and great grandparents. Some charts squeeze the names of great great grandparents. For each generation, basic names, dates and places of birth, marriage and death are outlined.

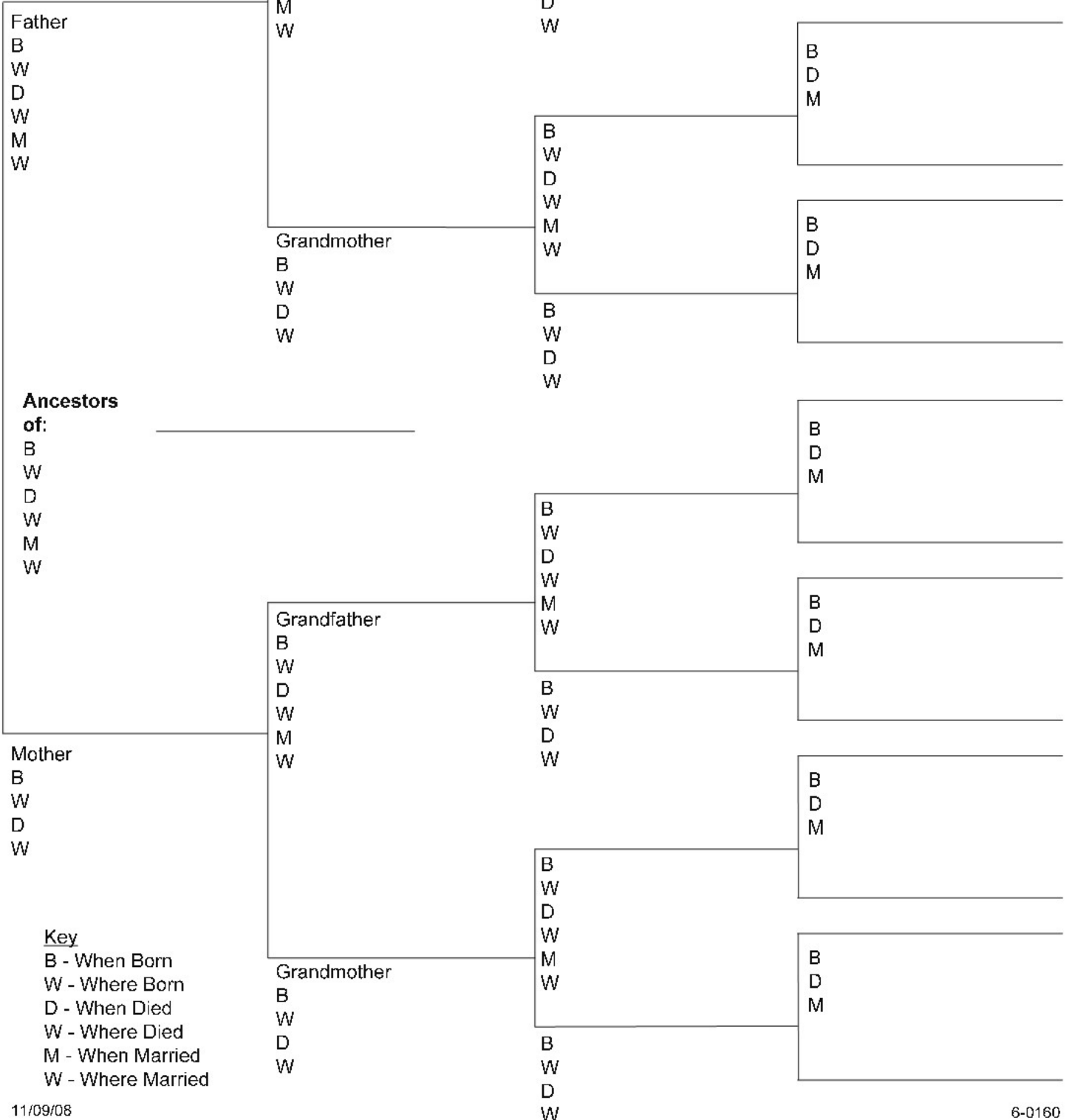

Below is a hand-made variation of a 5-generation chart that is completed. It starts with me at the far left, and provides details of my parents, grandparents and great grandparents. This is my Chart #1.

The names of my great great grandparents is on the far right, and have a number next to each. The numeral indicates the subsequent chart where their details will be entered, so that the tree may 'grow' and 'branch' as more details may be uncovered.

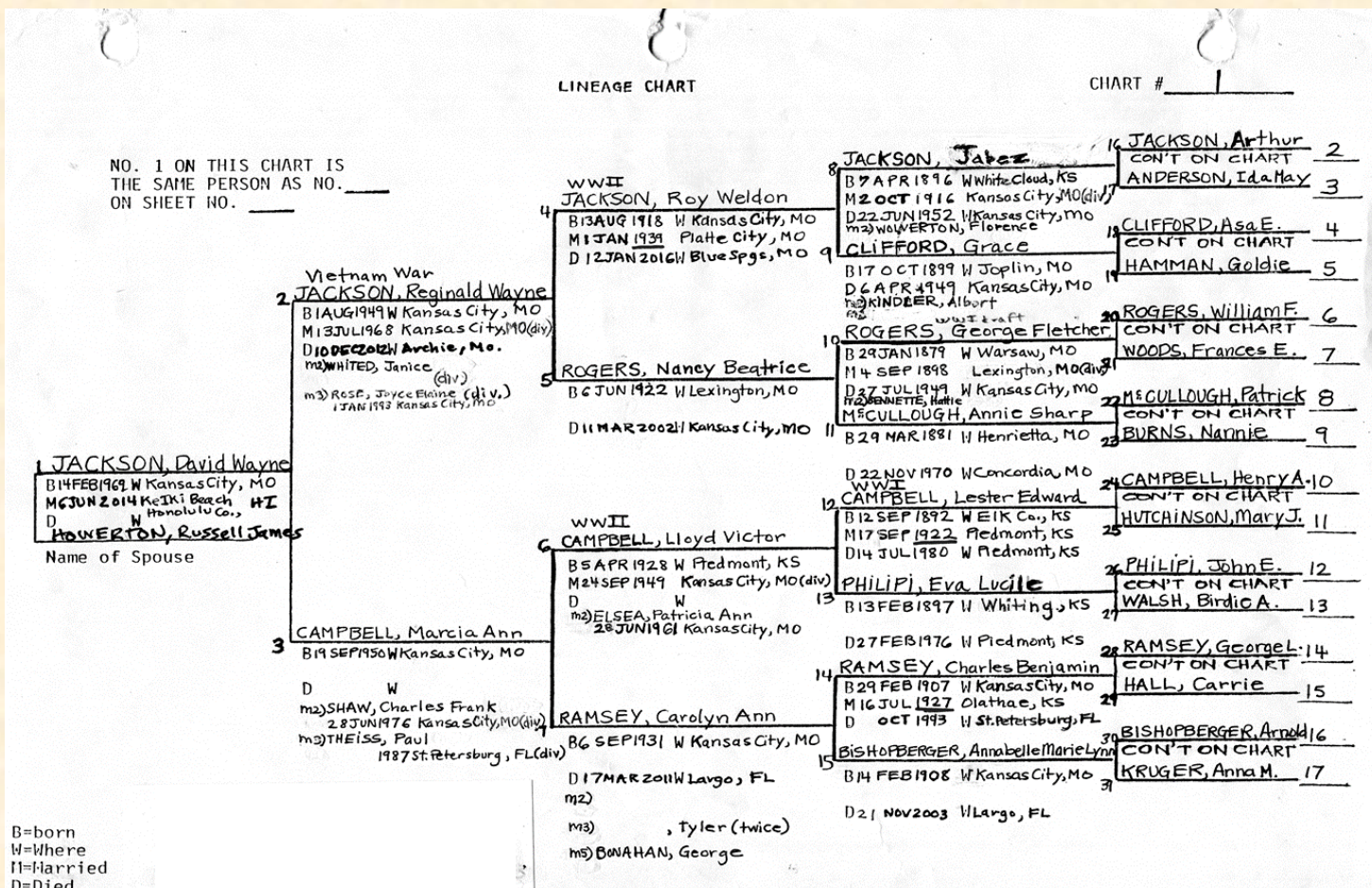
This chart (and others on the aforementioned link) help to outline one's family history, and so you may see where there are gaps needing further research.

These charts also help other genealogists quickly help give you pointers on what/where you might go next in your research.

You can also see migration patterns by studying the locations of each generation's birth, marriage and places of death.

Kansas City's SMITH Family Photographs Speak By David W. Jackson

A sizable selection of cabinet card photographs from the late 1800s to early 1900s was given to the editor "to find a good home." Prior to donating them to the Kansas City Public Library, where they will be cataloged and remain accessible to the public into the future, I discovered some facts that might provide useful to readers in the future. Family Group Charts will be filed with MAGIC.

After sorting, careful inspection for context clues, and a bit of research, the majority of the images appear to be friends and/or school mates of two siblings: Miss Nettie B. Smith and Mr. Lounie C. Smith. A few appear to be students of a third sibling, Mr. R. Everett Smith, who became a teacher. Most of them luckily have at least a name, which, with additional research might yield more about the sitter/s.

Two individuals were clearly marked as classmates of L. C. Smith at Lincoln High School, graduates in 1897, were William "Bill" Houston, and Leanna C. Osborne.

Some images were from other cities around the country, including: Chicago; Independence, Harrisonville, Glasgow, and St. Louis, Mo.; Paola and Cherryvale, Ks.

One child's photo was a son of Prof. M. D. and Mary Wise, "teacher at Penn School." Three ministers images include: Rev. O. T. Redd, D.D., pastor of the 2nd Baptist Church, 2642 Highland Ave; Bishop Albert Mack, Evangelist at St. James Baptist; and, Rev. W. C. Howell

A few images were unidentified completely...no name OR photographer's stamp.

And, while most of the photos were of African-Americans, a small few were Caucasians. The relationship/s to the Smith family is unknown.

The Smith family appeared in Kansas City in the U.S. Census between 1880-1940. Missouri Death Certificates (online at the State Archives) and

findagrave.com provided details about many of these folks who are buried in Highland Cemetery. And, marriage records for Jackson County also added some benchmarks. Nettie B. Smith married John S. Cannon. Their daughter, Erma M. married Mr.

MAGIC Member Shares....

Karen Stevenson has one great great grandfather, Robert S. Bland, who was a slave in Marshall Township, Platte County, Missouri.

He and his mother, Mariah, were slaves of Matthew Martin Bland. This information came from Civil War Compensation Records on Fold 3. After the Civil War he went to Oskaloosa, Kansas where he owned a 200-acre farm. He had one son, Robert, with his wife, Maria Freling, and eight children with his wife, Mary Ward.

Another great great grandfather and great great grandmother were slaves of Andrew and Elizabeth (Todd) Tribble, also of Platte County. This information is from oral history. Their names were Adam and America (Lowery) Todd. They also moved to Oskaloosa after the Civil War. They had twelve children.
