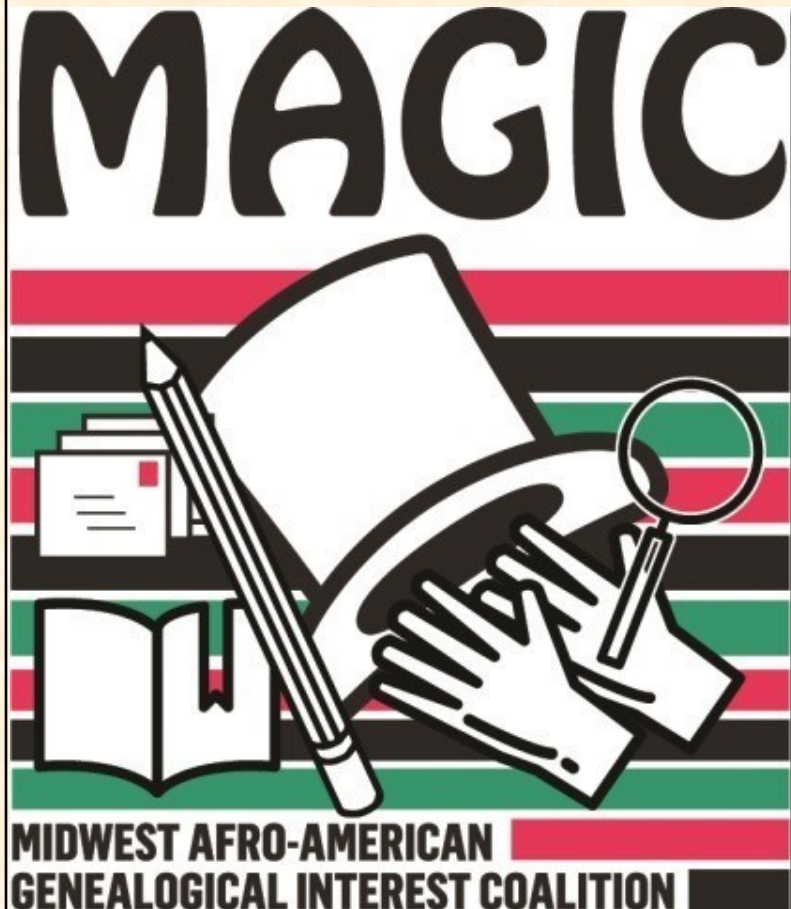

LINEAGE CHART IS A GREAT START

Below is an example of hand-made Lineage Chart #1 with 5 generations. It quickly and at a glance captures the names/dates/places of your DIRECT ancestors' birth/marriage/death dates. The names of great great grandparents go on the far right, and have a number next to each. That numeral indicates the subsequent chart where their details will be entered, so that the tree may 'grow' and 'branch' as more details may be uncovered.

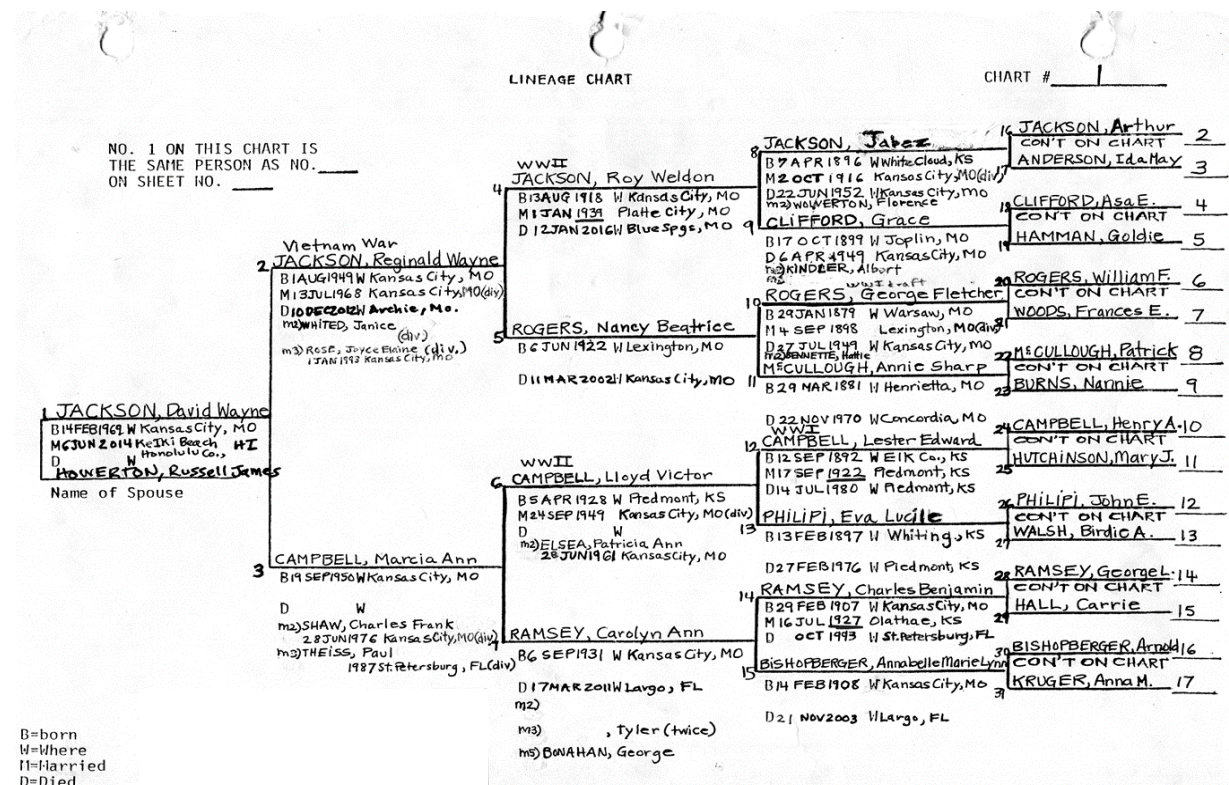
Don't worry about missing or blank entries on your chart...they are opportunities for you to see where there are gaps needing further research.

These charts also help other genealogists quickly help give you pointers on what/where you might go next in your research.

You can also see migration patterns by studying the locations of each generation's birth, marriage and places of death.

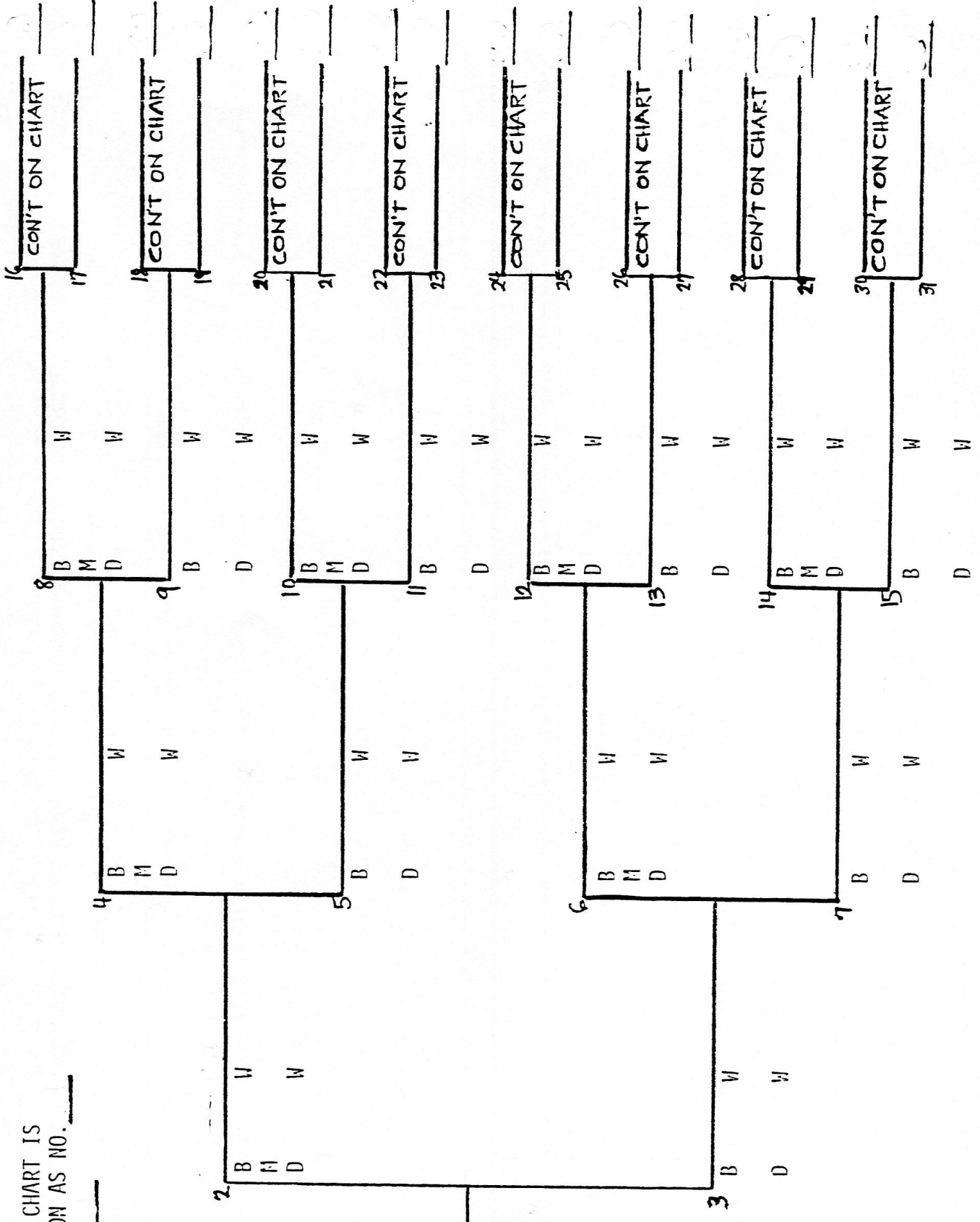

These are the photographers represented in the donation of over 100 photos that Bill Shelby donated to the Kansas City Public Library's Missouri Valley Room Special Collections Department. Most were identified; but, were only peripherally related to his family. Most were of African Americans. More research would have to be conducted to determine if these establishments were black owned. For now, the only fact is that these photographers had African American clientele at some point in their careers. Depending on the time frame/era, more drastic segregationist views may have been a factor. [The most widely known and prolific of Kansas City photographers was David Presley Thomson (Caucasian). His biography may be found among the serial of the Jackson County Historical Society JOURNAL.]

Nathan Boone's brothers owned a slave named Derry

Nathan Boone: "I remember when my father went beaver trapping on the Bourbeuse with Derry, a twenty-two year old Negro boy belonging to my brother, who liked to go out with Father while he trapped. Derry would stretch the skins and acted as cook and camp tender. In the fall of 1801. . . In October 1802, my father, Daniel Boone, accompanied by Derry, took his grandson, William Hays, Jr, and joined Flanders Callaway and his son James for a fall and winter's hunt along the Niango River. There they separated, with the Callaway's making one party; my father, Hays, and Derry another. They trapped on the Big Niango and Pomme de Terre but stayed a few miles apart. One day while Hays was absent trapping and Father had just ridden away from camp to look at traps, a party of eight or ten Osages came running toward the camp yelling and shooting off their guns. Derry took to his heels and hid. My father saw that the Indians were firing into the air, no doubt trying to frighten him and Derry away so they could take the goods from their camp.

My father rode back to camp and the Indians pulled him from his horse and took his chapeau coat. However, they were not openly hostile, so he called Derry back to camp. Derry managed to secrete a chunk of lead and Boone had a supply of powder concealed. The Indians took their furs, Father's chapeau coat, the powder in his horn, etc. They also had Derry cook a meal for them. Afterwards Father and Derry had enough hidden ammunition left to kill meat, so they remained trapping until spring. They finally came home with about two hundred beaver skins."

"About the fall of 1808, my father, Daniel Boone, took his grandson, William Hays Jr. and Derry on a fall and winter beaver hunt. They departed with four or five horses to ride out and pack back in. They reached the south side of the Missouri and crossed the Osage and the Lemine Rivers, intending to go on the Kansas River. Near where Independence now stands they met a lone Indian.

By signs this Indian invited my father and his party to his camp. They decided to accept his offer. They followed the Indian to very near his camp when he, with signs, informed them he would like to ride the lead packhorse. My father allowed him to do so; but when within sight of the camp, the Indian dashed ahead, alerted the camp, and twenty or thirty Indians came whooping out. My father and his party wheeled their horses and escaped but had to cut loose their traps and the few skins and furs they had taken.

My father became ill and, fearing he might not recover, gave instructions to Hays and Derry to bury him between two certain trees near camp. They had intended to go to the Kansas River, where I had previously been. This Indian robbery took place some ten or twelve miles south of the Missouri River, on the head of Sniabar (Little Schuyte Aber) Creek, about twelve or fifteen miles southwest of what is now Lexington, MO."

In June 1851, the Negro Derry died of flux in Marthasville, Montgomery County, Missouri. He was seventy-two years old. He was a good Negro. He would relate with much gusto stories about his two hunting trips with Father, especially the difficulties they had with the Indians, always giving himself the precedent in the narrative.
